Christie Conover

Was our 1st place competition winner in 2010. When I read the review of her performance as Pamina in *The Magic Flute* and saw some roles she has sung as her career has progressed, I decided to begin this article with a series of reviews. Christie is often referred to in these reviews by her then maiden name, Christie Hageman.

As Pamina, Christie Conover, was a wonder, at once probing and elegant; in "Ach ich fühls" she plumbed the depths of grief with singing of the utmost refinement. The Magic Flute, Minnesota Opera, 2015

The finest performance came from soprano Christie Conover as Caroline, singing with melting directness and bringing worlds of nuance to the character's plight. "Where Angels Fear to Tread," composer Mark Lane Weiser, Premier by Opera San Jose, 2015

Micaëla was sung and played with simple, Girl Scout grace by soprano Christie Hageman. An ideal courier of letters from Mommy, Hageman was able to maintain the sweet purity of her strong, winning instrument until the high passages of her Act 3 aria... revealed the woman beneath the guise. Her scarlet-clad Musetta was full of fiery physicality, her voice mellifluous and lovely, especially on her sweet chanson of a second-act aria. La Boheme, Minnesota Opera, June 2013

Hageman in the role of Juliette displayed an estimably large and well-focused instrument with a lovely timbre, perfect trill, and soaring top. Her portrayal grew increasingly secure and tender as the act progressed. Hageman's lovely bearing and sympathetic countenance could serve as a model of French grace and restraint. Christie Hageman Conover has been cast in an increasing number of new works, which surely requires courage on the part of a singer. It also reflects confidence in her among composers and directors, that they choose her above so many rising opera stars. Two good examples are that she covered the role of Sister James in the world premier of Doubt by Douglas Cuomo, Minnesota Opera (2013) and she portrayed the role of Jocelyn Jordan in the workshop of The Mountain Candidate (by Kevin Puts and Mark Campbell), which continued on to have its premier there in 2015. More recently, in 2016 she sang the world premier performance of scenes from The Origin by Bruce Adolphe.

Christie has always done well in competitions. Among them are The Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions (2011 Rocky Mountain Region Third Place Winner and 2012 Finalist) and of course our 2010 First Place Winner. Her training includes many months with the Minnesota Opera Resident Artist Program (2012-2014), the Aspen Music Festival Opera Theater Program (2011), and the Opera Colorado Young Artist program (2010-11). Most recently she sang for us in the program at our September 9, 2017 Fall Kickoff at the Denver Country Club.

An extraordinarily creative, talented woman who demonstrated amazing versatility, Christie has developed a wonderful musical program. "Women of the West," celebrating woman of the American frontier. History comes alive as she performs music inspired by the woman who put the "wild" in the Wild West: gunslinger and star of Buffalo Bill's Wild West show Annie Oakley; notorious outlaw Belle Starr; scandalous beauty Baby Doe Tabor; and frontierswoman, marksman, and lavish drinker Calamity Jane. In a show designed much like the house concerts of the time, Christie spans the musical repertoire from opera to musical theater to art song—even yodeling!




